






Worsening trends in an increasingly complex risk landscape

Sendai Framework for DRR, 2015-2030

The substantial reduction of disaster risk and losses in lives, livelihoods and health and in the economic, physical, social, cultural and environmental assets of persons, businesses, communities and countries

GOAL

Prevent new and reduce existing disaster risk through the implementation of integrated and inclusive economic, structural, legal, social, health, cultural, educational, environmental, technological, political and institutional measures that prevent and reduce hazard exposure and vulnerability to disaster, increase preparedness for response and recovery, and thus strengthen resilience

4 PRIORITIES

Understanding disaster risk	Strengthening disaster risk governance to manage disaster risk
Investing in disaster risk reduction for resilience	Enhancing disaster preparedness for effective response, and to "Build Back Better" in recovery, rehabilitation and reconstruction



Sendai Framework Midterm Review



Political Declaration <u>A/RES/77/289</u>

- Commends significant increase in countries with national disaster risk reduction strategies since 2015 and the considerable progress made in regional and subregional cooperation mechanisms for disaster risk reduction
- Calls for strengthened sub-regional cooperation on transboundary risk and disasters
- Need to develop or strengthen comprehensive disaster risk governance, including through full, equal, meaningful and inclusive
 "While we recognize that the implementation of the Sendai Framework is derivering positive results, we are deeply

concerned that the pace of implementation is not sufficient nor Risk Reduction equal." (MTR PD para 5)

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EFDRR Roadmap 2021-2030

The EFDRR Roadmap supports implementation of the Sendai Framework for DRR, by:

- Supporting regional, national and local disaster risk reduction strategies and actions by identifying shared gaps, challenges and opportunities.
- Highlighting effective arrangements for national and local sharing of good practices, pathways and opportunities for more risk-informed, gender-responsive, age-sensitive and inclusive policies, strategies, programmes and approaches.
- Promoting and supporting systems for regional collaboration and shared learning.






- Global network of 1600 cities and partners
